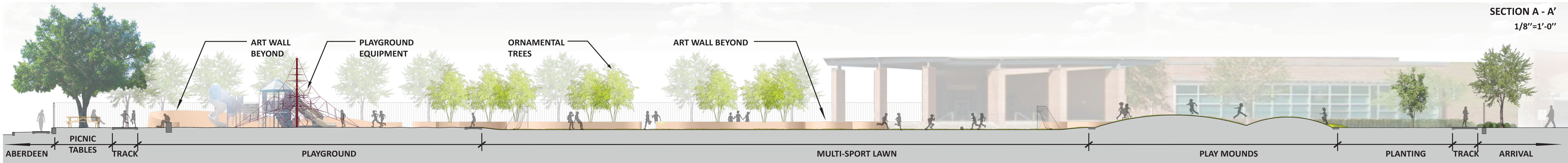


HUCKLEBERRY PARK



Huckleberry Park Playground is loosely themed on the popular 19th century Adventures of Huckleberry Finn by Mark Twain with undulating wall elements creating paths of discovery including active and passive recreational spaces, bold landforms, interactive music elements, and sculptural elements with particular emphasis on the design of a wide variety of play opportunities for children.

A. Huckleberry's Journey Art Wall is like the adventures of Huckleberry Finn as he travels down the river meeting new characters. The wall undulates, changes direction and connects many unique play experiences. Art created by Mark Twain students, guided by Art Teacher Mrs. Cowan will be integrated into its form memorializing students of today and into the future.

B. Phelps's Farm Multi-Function Great Lawn will be a newly leveled sports field with synthetic turf for durability and easy care. The "Great" place for school and community events is also the key to storm water mitigation, storing water during rain events and lessening the impacts of flooding downstream.

C. Jackson's Island Play Mounds are converging hills that promote physical activity, imagination and offer a vantage above the great lawn.

D. The Raft Climbing Play Equipment offers a new dimension of play opportunities including viewing, climbing, crawling and challenges the children physically.

E. Cabin in the Woods Play Equipment will feature traditional playground opportunities enhanced by using quality and crafted materials that stimulate children's imagination and challenge them physically. Vandalism, maintenance considerations, disabled access and safety standards are an important part in the design process.

F. The Royal Nonesuch Ga-Ga Ball Arena keeps children moving and physically active. Players must continuously move and focus on the game providing an exciting and fun way for children to develop skills that can be applied to other sports.

G. Literary and Interpretive Gateway will honor our bighearted donors and pay homage to the adventures of Huckleberry Finn and Mark Twain. This is the front porch and door into the park.

H. Way to Cairo Parkour and physical fitness structures offer challenges of agility, balance and coordination skills.

I. Mark Twain's Adventure Trail is a newly configured track that ties the entire park together. Crawl, walk and run - get moving.

J. Conversation Garden for sitting in the shade of the trees and having a conversation with your friends or simply reading a book in the outdoors.

K. Donor Plaza commemorates the contributions of Huckleberry Park's generous donors. The people and organizations listed here have demonstrated an understanding of the value of Mark Twain and Huckleberry Park to the community, the City, and beyond. Located beneath the park's most beautiful shade trees, the Donor Plaza creates an inspiring community gateway.

L. Event Track and Stage serves track and field events, but also becomes a multi-functional level space that overlooks the Great Lawn. This is the stage that will feature our community talent or can be lined with concession stands serving our carnivals like Spooky Spaghetti.
